

What is NY Forward?

NY Forward (NYF) launched in 2022 to invigorate and enliven downtowns in New York's smaller and rural communities—the type of downtowns found in villages, hamlets, and other small, neighborhood-scale municipal centers.

Similar to the Downtown Revitalization Initiative (DRI), and with Department of State planning and implementation support, NYF communities develop a Strategic Investment Plan that includes a slate of readily implementable projects aimed at revitalizing downtown areas, while providing a higher quality of life for all residents.

- Public engagement
- Downtown profile and assessment
- Vision, goals, and revitalization strategies
- Project identification and development
- Project implementation

Process and Timeline

Selection


Communities submit applications to the REDCs (Regional Economic Development Council). After soliciting community input in 2022, Cornwall submitted an application and was selected in 2023.

Planning

Selected communities will develop a
Strategic Investment Plan that includes
a vision for the downtown and a
catalog of transformative projects,
based on community outreach and
input. That plan forms the foundation
for immediate and ongoing project
implementation.

Implementation

NY Forward awards will be used to implement the most transformative projects from the Strategic Investment Plan. Additional projects may be implemented through the CFA (Consolidated Funding Application) or other funding sources.




What is the Local Planning Committee (LPC)?

As the steering body of the process, the LPC meets regularly to brainstorm ideas, provide direction to the consultant team, review planning documents, discuss potential projects, and prioritize actions.

The LPC members, working with the consultant team and State planners, will determine the slate of projects to be included in the Strategic Investment Plan.

Why this boundary?

- Central business districts





Submit your ideas: Open Call for Projects

All projects, including those submitted in the community's NYF application, must be submitted through the Open Call for Projects.

The Call for Projects opens on **June 16, 2023** and closes on **July 21, 2023**.

Project Criteria

- Projects should be **aligned with State and local goals** and demonstrate strong community support.
- Projects should be **well-developed** and ready to proceed in the near-term in a way that will jump start the reinvigoration of the NYF area.
- Projects should have a positive impact on the revitalization of the downtown by attracting other public and private investment at a scale appropriate for community.
- Projects should result in **secondary benefits** to both the community and project sponsor and improve quality of life in the neighborhood.
- Investment of NYF funds in the project should represent an effective and efficient use of public resources.


